

‘Affordability Agenda’ On Breakfast Agenda Congressman Ryan Addresses Ulster Chamber

U.S. Rep. Pat Ryan promises to talk about kitchen table issues when he addresses the Chamber’s next breakfast meeting on April 16 at Diamond Mills Hotel & BLACKBARN Hudson Valley in Saugerties.

“The financial pressure folks are feeling right now is intense, and it’s across the board,” said Ryan, a Democrat from Gardiner. “Combating the affordability crisis is my absolute top priority—the first thing I did this year was introduce my Affordability Agenda, an in-depth plan to bring down the cost of living for Hudson Valley families.”

The breakfast, scheduled from 7:30-9:00 a.m., is sponsored by Sawyer Savings Bank with additional support from Sawyer Motors.

Ryan, elected to a second two-year term last November, said he introduced his Affordability Agenda in Congress “because we’re all feeling the burden of high prices and Hudson Valley families need relief” whether it’s groceries, housing, prescription drugs or even Social Security.

“We need to tackle each and every one of these issues head-on,” Ryan said. “We need to be protecting Social Security, bringing down grocery prices, making housing more affordable and getting our farmers the support they need. Whether it’s fighting back against Big Pharma jacking up your health care costs, Wall Street increasing your housing costs, or corrupt politicians trying to take your Social Security, I will always stand up and fight for Hudson Valley families.”

Ryan said his Lower Grocery Prices Act is bipartisan legislation that would require the U.S. Government Accountability Office

to analyze the price of groceries over the last 20 years, provide effective solutions on how to lower costs and develop a national plan to combat high prices.

His housing agenda includes four bills from Ryan that he says would lower mortgage rates, “crack down on the Wall Street firms responsible for jacking up housing costs,” incentivize development and cut through bureaucratic red tape.

Ryan said a bill called the Stopping Pharma’s Ripoffs and Drug Savings for All Act would “rein in Big Pharma’s current abuse of U.S. patent law and make it easier to produce less-costly generic drug alternatives.”

The Protecting Social Security Act would ensure that Social Security benefits cannot be cut, that seniors and families will continue to receive the benefits they are owed and that every county in his congressional district has a Social Security office to serve the community.

Ryan, who has been holding several town halls across his sprawling district, also recently joined congressional colleagues from New York and New Jersey in asking EPA Administrator Lee Zeldin to rule that additional PCB clean-up is needed in the Hudson River.

“For decades, General Electric has put their profits ahead of the health and safety of

Hudson Valley families, and nobody knows that as well as our fellow New Yorker, Administrator Lee Zeldin. The time for talking is over; the time for action is now,” Ryan said.

Ryan, who grew up in Kingston, served as Ulster County Executive for three years, including during the COVID-19 pandemic, before his election to Congress. He worked in the technology field before entering politics after attending the U.S. Military Academy at West Point and serving two tours in Iraq.

The 18th Congressional District represented by Ryan includes the city of Kingston and the towns of Woodstock, Kingston, Ulster, Saugerties, Plattekill, Marlborough, Lloyd, New Paltz, Esopus and part of Gardiner in Ulster County. Orange County and a portion of Dutchess County are also in the district.

Mariner’s Harbor Hosts Next Mixer Enjoy A Night On The Waterfront

Mariner’s Harbor, one of the first new restaurants to relocate to the Kingston waterfront in 2001, is largely credited for reviving the historic Rondout district. Now, 24 years later, the business is still going strong and hosting the Chamber’s next networking Mixer on April 30. The Mixer, at 1 Broadway in Kingston, is sponsored by HOP Energy/KoscoHeritage.

“The Chamber has always treated me great, so I want to be able to have a Mixer down here,” said owner Sal Guido. “I know the Mixers are a good time and a lot of fun for everybody.

“The timing for me is also perfect because I want to get everybody thinking about the waterfront in the spring and all the businesses that are downtown. We haven’t had a Mixer down here in a while.”

In fact, the last Chamber Mixer scheduled at Mariner’s was in March 2020, and that had to be canceled as restrictions on group meetings went enacted during the first days of the pandemic.

Guido said the entire restaurant will be open that night, including the deck and patio. In the case of inclement weather, the restaurant has a glass-enclosed porch with views of the Rondout Creek.

There also will be plenty of food and drink, including bacon-wrapped shrimp, mini tuna bowls, oysters Rockefeller and more.

“We’ll have a pretty wide variety of options,” Guido said.

The original Mariner’s Harbor opened in 1981 in Highland under family patriarch Frank Guido. Mariner’s Harbor relocated to the Kingston waterfront in 2001 under the ownership of Frank Guido, his son, Mark, and Sal Guido, who is Frank’s cousin. Sal

Guido assumed ownership in 2017 and said the last eight years have gone well.

“My heart and soul have always been in this place,” he said. “I love downtown, so I’m thrilled with the way things have gone.”

Guido credited the restaurant’s success to a core group of long-serving employees.

“I am extremely lucky to have my staff, and I personally think it’s the best location in Kingston,” he said.

That wasn’t always the case as Kingston’s waterfront had grown dormant over the years before the Guidos took a chance on a renaissance. They purchased the historic building at 1 Broadway, which formerly housed the Daily Freeman newspaper for many decades.

Guido credited the Downtown Kingston Business Association and former Kingston mayors T.R. Gallo and James Sottile, along with current Mayor Steve Noble, for the rebirth.

The Rondout has exploded in growth in recent years with a host of restaurants, art galleries, antique shops and other small businesses making the waterfront a true tourist destination.

“When we first opened, there wasn’t much down here,” Guido recalls. “When I was younger, you really didn’t come down here much. It wasn’t the prettiest of places. That’s all changed.

“People gravitate to the water. They always have and I’m very proud to be part of how great downtown looks and how appealing it is not only to Kingstonians, but also the people coming from out of town.”

More Than Just Clothing

Shu-Shi Apparel Crafted With Love, Made By Hand

There’s no place like Woodstock, or, for that matter, Ulster County, to inspire creatives to think big. Sharona Ozeri knows that as much as any other local artist and credits her move to upstate New York as the impetus for bringing her women’s apparel line known as Shu-Shi to the next level.

Her online fashion brand features trendy, resort-inspired clothing, including sarongs, shrugs and ponchos, which are ethically made by artisans in Indonesia.

For years, Ozeri had sold her garments exclusively at holiday markets in Union Square and Grand Central Terminal, but her recent move to Ulster County has opened doors to new possibilities. She’s since repositioned herself as an e-tailer, who sells her unique apparel on Amazon to women looking for an aesthetic that embraces comfort, style and versatility.

“Living in Woodstock and the surrounding Ulster County area has been an incredible experience,” Ozeri said. “The quality of life here is unmatched. The beauty of the Catskills, the vibrant arts scene and the sense of community make it special. For me, it’s the perfect balance of inspiration and tranquility. Being surrounded by nature fuels my creativity, while the artistic community provides a great support network. There’s also a strong entrepreneurial spirit here, with many small businesses, makers and artists thriving.

“From a business perspective, the shift to e-commerce has made it possible to live in a peaceful place like Woodstock while still reaching customers worldwide,” she added. “I love that I can enjoy the serenity of upstate New York while running an international fashion brand.”

Ozeri launched Shu-Shi in 1991 after traveling the globe and connecting with fabric makers in Southeast Asia, particularly, Bali, a province of Indonesia. As one who had studied at the Fashion Institute for Technology and Parsons School of Design in New York City, she was drawn to the island’s rich textile tradition. To this day, she still works with artisans on the island who dye fabrics in the ancient batik method, which involves wax application.

“My clothing is made with care, using ethical production practices. I’ve worked with the same manufacturers for over 30 years, ensuring fair wages and sustainable craftsmanship. Unlike mass-produced brands, Shu-Shi focuses on quality and individuality. Each piece has a story and is designed to last,” she said.

Some of her bestsellers include sheer shrugs, lightweight knit cardigans, as well as solid and printed sarong wraps, beach cover-up skirts. Other top items are kimonos, kaftans, halter dresses, tie-dye tunic dresses, wrap dresses and beach poncho dresses. Most of Shu-Shi’s outfits reflect the Boho-chic style known for its vibrant colors and relaxed silhouettes.

“Shu-Shi is designed for women who appreciate comfort, style and individuality,” Ozeri

said. “They include travelers, free spirits and creative professionals who seek effortless fashion that seamlessly transitions from daily wear to special occasions. My pieces are lightweight, comfortable and unique, with many handmade elements that make them special. Whether you’re heading to the beach, going on an adventure or just looking for something stylish and effortless, Shu-Shi brings a little wanderlust into your wardrobe.”

Ozeri, who grew up in a small fishing village in the Mediterranean, began her career designing children’s clothing but later transitioned to women’s fashion due to demand and because it was easier to produce with fewer size variations and regulations. Many of her designs are still handmade, and now that she’s living in Woodstock—where the artisan spirit soars—she’s eager to connect with others who prize self-expression and skilled workmanship.

“Living in Woodstock has given me the space and inspiration to continue growing my business while staying connected to my values of quality, creativity and ethical fashion,” she said. “I love being part of a community that appreciates artistry and individuality, and I’m grateful to call this area home.”

Ozeri added that she is thrilled to be a Chamber member and is anxious to meet other local business owners. In the future, she is exploring the possibility of opening a pop-up, but for now, she welcomes fellow Chamber members to explore her collection at loveshushi.com and connect with her about future collaborations.
