Congressman Pat Ryan To Speak At April Breakfast

Tackling the “affordability crisis”—from groceries to housing—will be the main topic when U.S. Rep. Pat Ryan speaks at the April 9 Chamber breakfast, according to his press office.

Sawyer Savings Bank is sponsoring the breakfast from 7:30-9:00 a.m., and Sawyer Motors is the underwriting sponsor for the event, which will be held at Diamond Mills, 25 South Partition St. in Saugerties.

Ryan, a Democrat from Gardiner who represents the 18th Congressional District, said he plans to talk about the “across-the-board financial pressures” people are feeling and the legislative action he has taken to address it.

“Combating the affordability crisis is my absolute top priority,” he said. “The first thing I did last year was introduce my Affordability Agenda, an in-depth plan to bring down the cost of living for Hudson Valley families. We need to be protecting Social Security, bringing down grocery prices, making housing more affordable and getting our farmers the support they need.”

“Whether it’s fighting back against Big Pharma jacking up your health care costs, Wall Street increasing your housing costs or corrupt politicians trying to take your Social Security, I will always stand up and fight for Hudson Valley families.”

Ryan said his affordability agenda delivers real cost-cutting relief for Hudson Valley families. That includes the Lower Grocery Price Act, bipartisan legislation, introduced in 2025 by Ryan and fellow House member Mike Lawler, a Republican, which requires the Government Accountability Office to submit a report to Congress on changes in the Consumer Price Index for food over the past 20 years. The report must also include recommendations to

help lower food costs.

Ryan said he has also introduced a housing agenda, which includes bills to build more housing and cut through red tape, all while minimizing government waste.

One of those bills is the Working Families Housing Tax Credit, which builds on the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit, incentivizing developers to create housing that meets the needs of all hard-working families, not just those at the highest income levels.

Another effort by Ryan to help struggling families is his legislation to lower the price of prescription drugs. Known as Stopping Pharma’s Ripoffs and Drug Savings for All Act, the bill would stop Big Pharma’s abuse of current U.S. patent law and make less-costly, generic alternatives easier to produce.

“Finally, my Protecting Social Security Act will ensure that Social Security benefits cannot be cut, that seniors and families will continue to receive the benefits they are owed and that every county in NY-18 has a Social Security office to serve the community,” he said of the bill he introduced in August 2024.

As far as what he’s done to help local businesses, Ryan noted that he introduced three bills last year—the Small Business RELIEF Act to pay back small business owners and exempt them from paying tariffs; the Small Business Regulatory Reduction Act to alleviate regulatory costs; and the DUMP Red Tape Act to help small business owners directly access the Small Business Administration.

“These bills will put the power back where it should be – with the businesses that keep our communities moving forward,” Ryan said.

“I’m proud that both the Small Business Regulatory Act and the DUMP Red Tape Act passed the House last year. I’ll always fight for small businesses and against policies that screw them over – no matter what.”

“We don’t have billion-dollar corporations in the Hudson Valley,” Ryan added. “What we proudly do have are tons of small businesses that clothe our kids, feed our families and employ our friends. They deserve federal policy that lowers costs, not cost-raising tariffs and endless red tape. Small businesses are the backbone of our Hudson Valley community.”

Prior to his election to Congress, Ryan served as Ulster County Executive for three years. He worked in the technology field before entering politics after attending the U.S. Military Academy at West Point and serving two tours in Iraq.

The 18th Congressional District represented by Ryan includes the city of Kingston and the towns of Woodstock, Kingston, Ulster, Saugerties, Plattekill, Marlborough, Lloyd, New Paltz, Esopus and part of Gardiner in Ulster County. Orange County and a portion of Dutchess County are also in the district.

Ashokan Center To Host April Mixer

The long, hard winter appears to be behind us, and the Ashokan Center in Olivebridge is ready to celebrate Spring with fresh beginnings in an inspiring setting with forests, meadows, nature trails, a waterfall and covered bridge.

The 385-acre nature preserve at 477 Beaverkill Road will host the Chamber’s April 21st Networking Mixer from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. with the aim of reconnecting the business community (post-cabin fever) and spotlighting its many outdoor educational programs and retreat and conference facilities.

The Mixer Sponsor is the Mid-Hudson Valley Federal Credit Union.

“This is a place that fosters a lot of positivity and connection and respite,” said Caroline Bailey, Director of Community Events and Outreach at the Ashokan Center. “Our mission is inspiring learning and building community through shared experiences in nature, history, music and art. We do all kinds of things that encompass those pillars. At the heart of everything is community. That’s why we love doing the Chamber Mixers.”

Throughout the year, the Ashokan Center hosts school field trips, festivals, concerts, summer camp, wellness retreats, square dancing, guided hikes and themed events like Bluegrass camp, banjo weekend and its acclaimed Summer and Winter hoots.

Tucked away from the noise of the world, the Ashokan Center is an ideal spot to host a retreat or conference. The natural setting with multiple ceremony sites to choose from also make it a good choice for weddings. Lodging options include private rooms, dorm-style

bunkhouses and campsites.

“It is a hidden gem,” Bailey said. “There’s just something about it. People connect here in a special way. Our staff is driven by the mission, so they embody building that community spirit. We love having people visit so they can see it for themselves.”

The Ashokan Center, an independent music and nature nonprofit, was established in 2008, but it’s history goes back to 1967 when the Ashokan Field Campus was owned and operated by SUNY New Paltz.

When acclaimed musicians Jay Ungar and Molly Mason (known for their American roots music) learned that SUNY New Paltz was on the brink of selling the Ashokan Field Campus to a potential developer, they formed the Ashokan Foundation, a new nonprofit designed to save the historic nature preserve.

Going way back, the property was a favored hunting and fishing spot for the Munsee Indians for generations. The first mill and blacksmith shop in Ulster County were built on the grounds by Lemuel Winchell, who later constructed Winchell’s Inn, Ashokan’s historic centerpiece.

Among the property’s other assets are the single span, 62-foot-long covered bridge built in 1885 and Cathedral Gorge with a scenic 80-foot waterfall.

Bailey said the team at the Ashokan Center can’t wait to open the doors to Chamber members. Unger and Mason are expected to welcome everyone and perform some of their music at the Mixer. A spread of hors d’oeuvres prepared by William Warnes, the Ashokan



Center’s longtime chef, will be available. Chamber members will also be treated to campus tours and guided hikes.

“We want this place to be a vital resource to the community,” Bailey said. “We love feedback from community members about what they would like to see in our programming or what they’d like to host here. We’re always looking for those opportunities to hear from others, and the Chamber Mixer is a good way to do that.”

A ceremonial Chamber Ribbon Cutting with local elected officials will open the ExpoMixer at 3:45 p.m. After that, Chamber members can expect non-stop networking until the event closes at 7:00 p.m., giving exhibitors a chance to pitch their products and services to an even bigger audience.

"Starting later in the day will give more members a chance to attend the event at the end of the workday," Todd said.

John Naccarato, President and CEO at Naccarato Insurance, highly recommends that business owners consider reserving a booth at the ExpoMixer. He believes so strongly in the event that his company, headquartered in Saugerties, has backed it as the Presenting Sponsor for 14 years.

The ExpoMixer will be open exclusively to members of the Chamber of Commerce and their guests—another benefit of Chamber membership, Todd noted, adding that the Sawyer Motors shuttle service will run throughout the event, picking up and dropping off exhibitors and attendees

"Just being a kid from Kingston, a son of the city, it felt very special," said James, a multimedia reporter at Spectrum News. "Last year, I had the opportunity

to present the same award I won to Drew Andrews (Executive Director of the Center for Creative Education). It's always a privilege to stand next to these giants in the community who have made a difference and continue to make a difference. They are beacons of light and pillars in the community."

The opportunity to toast a new round of community pillars is upon us as the Ulster Chamber seeks nominations for its annual Black Business Community Celebration, which will be held on June 18 from 4:30 to 8:00 p.m. at Ulster Savings Bank's Corporate Headquarters, 180 Schwenk Drive in Kingston.
