56th Honorary Irish Person Of The Year To Be Named At March Breakfast

Miriam “Mo” Gibbons did something last year that no other freshly named Honorary Irish Person of the Year has ever done, and it was a deeply touching moment.

When Ulster Chamber President Ward Todd picked her at the sold-out Peter B. Mathews St. Patrick’s Breakfast, she burst into tears.

“It was a total shock,” she recalled. “Ward said, ‘You’re the first person who ever cried.’ If you want to know how to silence me, give me an award that I had no idea I would receive. I literally had no words, and that’s a first for me.”

The light-hearted and festive Peter B. Mathews St. Patrick’s Breakfast, sponsored each year by The Reis Group, returns on Tuesday, March 17, from 7:30 – 9:00 a.m. at The Venue Uptown at the Best Western Plus in Kingston.

The Ulster County Ancient Order of Hibernians will kick off the festivities with thundering bagpipes, and the T. McCann Band will be back by popular demand, playing lively Irish ditties.

Expect the usual childlike excitement as attendees play the guessing game about this year’s honoree. Man or woman? Irish or non-Irish? That person sitting next to you? A well-known name? Someone who goes beyond the extra mile? Maybe even you?

Truth is, anyone in the jam-packed room is game for the highly coveted title that dates back to 1970 when Anthony Pizzarelli, President of Ulster Tool and Die Corp., was named the first

Honorary Irish Person. Credit for Ulster County’s beloved Irish tradition goes to the late Len Cane, Chamber President from 1969 to 2003. He started it to bring the community together on St. Patrick’s Day and over the years, the title has gone to local luminaries including bankers, hospital administrators, gym owners, roofers, realtors, comptrollers and more.

As usual, the morning will begin with a toast to all the former Honorary Irish Persons of the Year who passed away. That list, sadly, will also include the 2024 Honorary Irish Person, Alex Stier, who passed away just recently.

Gibbons shares the traits of previous Honorees. She is known for her big heart and warm personality. She is also a former Ulster Chamber board member and current Chamber Ambassador. As such, you’ll see her at almost every function, including Chamber Ribbon Cuttings, where she cheers on new members.

Additionally, Gibbons has been an active member of the Kingston Kiwanis Club for 15 years and is the past president of the Kingston Uptown Business Association (KUBA). Gibbons also volunteers at People’s Place.

While she meets the criteria for being selected Honorary Irish Person, Gibbons said

she was blindsided at last year’s breakfast.

“I guess I don’t see myself in that elite group of former honorees,” she said. “That’s why I never expected to be picked. I just do what I do. I love giving back to this community, and it goes back to my parents. On my mother’s refrigerator, there’s a funny, little magnet that says, ‘Please stop me from volunteering,’ so I guess that’s where I got it from.”

After the honor sunk in last year, Gibbons said she celebrated all day and enjoyed an evening out with her husband that included a corned beef and cabbage dinner. “I’m a whiskey girl, so, of course, I had my Jameson,” she added.

As for this year’s honoree, Gibbons said while she wouldn’t recommend crying, she would advise that person going up to the podium to grasp the moment and be 100 percent real.

“It’s very humbling, so embrace it. Don’t prepare your remarks. People want that surprise, so just go with it. It’s a wonderful moment for everyone,” she said.

A Haven For Boys To Thrive

Children’s Home Of Kingston To Host March Mixer

This is a year of firsts for an agency that is celebrating its 150th anniversary this September.

The Children’s Home of Kingston is marking the milestone with its first Ulster Chamber Mixer on March 24 from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. The Mixer, being sponsored by CDPHP, will be held in the school gymnasium and is expected to raise awareness about the nonprofit that provides residential and academic programs and services for males ages 10 to 21 in a highly structured therapeutic environment. Delicious complimentary refreshments will be provided by the Foxhall Deli.

The Children’s Home is being led for the first time by an Afro-Latina, who is taking the agency to new heights. Leila Santana, Chief Executive Officer, said she is looking forward to welcoming Chamber members to the five-acre campus and showing them how The Children’s Home of Kingston is making a difference in the lives of boys and young men.

“We offer alternative placement for kids who can’t be in a mainstream school because of mental health diagnoses such as ADHD, depression, anxiety, schizophrenia or children who have school avoidance that can be tied to COVID and kids facing challenges in their family life,” Santana said.

Students are referred to The Children’s Home residential program through special education committees and Department of Social Services programs, she added. The residential treatment program offers a comprehensive therapeutic approach that includes clinical and educational interventions targeting the issues that disrupted the

youth’s ability to remain at home and in their community.

Grove Street Academy, the educational program at The Children’s Home, provides a nontraditional classroom setting offering emotionally and learning-disabled students a structured, personalized experience in a small setting that allows teachers to individualize lessons and modify classwork, focusing on a multisensory approach, Santana said.

“We have a 98 percent attendance rate,” she said. “Our students want to be here. We’re really proud of that.”

The Children’s Home has a 62-member staff, including special education teachers, teacher aides, school principal, psychologist, social worker, clinical director, youth care workers, an operations director, compliance officer, kitchen staff and a security team. It also has what Santana calls a “redirection team,” a group of professionals who are trained to spot daily issues and help coregulate them.

Monique Newkirk, Director of Development at The Children’s Home, said her department now collaborates with school districts to see how they can work together—another first for the agency.

“We haven’t had members of the community come here for a while, so we’re looking forward to meeting them,” she said. “I hope people come in with an open heart and mind and say, ‘Hey, what can I do to help?’”

One of the outcomes Santana and Newkirk are hoping for is the development of partnerships with the business community to enhance their programs.

“It takes a community to uplift a nonprofit,” Santana said. “We have something special here, and people need to know about it.”

Ways that businesses can help include donating time to complement programming and helping to improve the facilities.

Santana urged fellow Chamber members to attend the Mixer and promised they’ll be moved by what they see.

“We have been here for 150 years, and this is a nonprofit that wants to make a difference in the mental health world, so youth can find their way, regardless of their circumstances,” she said. “My team works really hard, and I want Chamber members to meet the people who make the magic happen every day. They believe in the mission that was created 150 years ago.”

The Meat Of The Matter

Smokehouse Of The Catskills Thriving Under New Ownership

When Jim Ferraro and his business partners heard that Smokehouse of the Catskills might be closing in the fall of 2024 due to the owner's imminent retirement, they swooped in to save the day.

The foursome, including Ferraro, his father, Joe, John Roessner and Jana Blazicek bought the iconic business slightly more than a year ago from longtime owners Mike and Heidi Ferraro (cousins to the new father-son owners) and have kept things pretty much the same for its adoring customer base. Ferraro and his partners say this new venture has opened their eyes to a whole new way of doing business.

"To be honest, it's been a lot of fun learning the hospitality business. I grew up in Saugerties, so I recognize a lot of the customers. My partners and I have all taken on different roles to get through our first year, including running the registers and taking orders. It's a different pace, but we've enjoyed diving in and running something that's more business to consumer."

Smokehouse of the Catskills is a specialty German-style butcher shop known for its hand-cut, premium meats that are smoked on the premises using Old World techniques.

Austrian-born brothers Bill and Peter Muellner opened it in 1945. Back then, it was known as Veteran Pork Store. Ferraro said he, like many other locals, often visited the store with his parents and said part of the charm of the business is that it still feels like it did all those years ago.



"It's a staple in the community," Ferraro said. "We've made no physical changes—just some equipment upgrades because of things wearing out. The previous owners did a good job of keeping the place nice and clean. We've added some new products, but we wanted to be sure to keep the products that our customer base likes and give them the same experience they've been used to all these years."

Smokehouse of the Catskills is known for its hand-cut steaks, store-made brisket, chops, knackwurst, bratwurst, baloney, veal and double-smoked bacon. It has also earned a sterling reputation for

the artisan craft of sausage making. The recipe, according to Ferraro, has "been around forever."

Smokehouse also sells groceries, including European imports like mustard, specialty cheeses, German egg noodles and chocolates and other staples like fresh, local eggs. As much as possible, Ferraro and partners source locally, getting their chicken from Campanelli Poultry Farm in Kenoza Lake (Sullivan County), baked goods from Deising's and mushrooms from Wiltbank Farm in Saugerties.

The store, which is open Thursday through Sunday, draws a lot of repeat customers, but on any given weekend, Ferraro said he meets new visitors.

"I see license plates from all over—New Jersey, Rhode Island, Connecticut and elsewhere. The reputation the store has had, and we hope to continue, is so good that people know about us from all over the tri-state area. We really are a destination. This is not a walkable area, so people deliberately seek us out, and while there's competition from the butcher point of view, Smokehouse is unique from the standpoint of what we do across the board. I don't know of another place that offers all that we do."

And contrary to what some may think, the meat prices at Smokehouse are comparable to local grocery stores, he added.

"When people think of a specialty smokehouse, they tend to think the price is outside of their budget. To that I would say, 'Hey, come give us a shot. I think you'll be pleasantly surprised that



we're competitively priced."

Ferraro said he and his partners have enjoyed the face-to-face contact with shoppers and look forward to carrying on the legacy of the Deutsche Metzgerei (German butcher shop) for years to come.

"We appreciate all the customers who have continued to patronize the business under the new ownership, and we're happy to have kept the business alive."

Gattine offers a variety of packages at 3C ranging from Pro Service all the way up to something he calls the "Gentleman Spec," a service designed for vehicles with ultra-sensitive, high-end and expensive materials that require a more "deliberate approach," according to Gattine. 
